CALL FOR ABSTRACTS: Submissions due November 5, 2021

Want to give a presentation but not sure you can attend? Check out these options!

TALKS: Attend and give a talk in person -or- pre-record a video of your presentation through our virtual studio. The video of your talk will be played during the live session, and you will answer attendee questions by email.

POSTERS: You may attend and present a poster in person -or- submit a PDF of your poster for viewing on the virtual platform for on-demand viewing. In person poster presentations will not be live streamed.



Still waiting on research results?

If you're working on a research project and your data is not finalized yet, you can submit a preliminary abstract by the **November 5** deadline, and provide an updated version later, which must be submitted by **February 4**. *NOTE: Instructions how to provide a final abstract will be provided by a reviewer.*

Here are a few things you need to know about giving a talk or presenting a poster:

- English is the official language of the conference and linguistic accuracy is the responsibility of the author.
- You must use the [abstract template](#), and abstracts must be submitted online by **Friday, November 5, 2021**.
- Both in person and remote presenters must register and pay the full participation fee **by Friday, March 4, 2022**.
- Remote speakers must use our virtual studio to pre-record their talk no later than **Friday, May 13, 2022**.
- All poster presenters (in person and remote) must upload their poster PDF no later than **Friday, May 13, 2022**.
- All deadlines will be strictly adhered to, so don't delay, start preparing today if you wish to participate.
