



Political will to carry out identified goal

Half Moon Bay

Implementation:

Robust off the Boat Sales

Funding:

Self Funding

Managing Entity:

Fishermen, Harbor Districts

Key Takeaway:

Provides connection with community, increases earnings, but small volume.



Stability & Value

Port San Luis – Harbor Terrace

Implementation:

Regulatory approval: Coastal Development Permit

Funding: California Coastal Conservancy, Ioan (\$400,000)

Managing Entity: Port San Luis Harbor District

Key Takeaway: Codified in policy, diverse collaboration, innovative approach

Morro Bay

Implementation:

Formation of community non-profit

Funding:

California Fisheries Fund (CFF)

Managing Entity:

MBCQF; diverse leadership

Key Takeaway:

Anchors resource in the community

Terminal Island, PoLA

Longer lease terms for tenants

Funding:

Port and Developer Split (\$1.5M/\$6M)


