- 13% of undiscovered oil
- 85% is offshore
- 45% is in Alaska and Canada

Declining production on Alaska's North Slope

- Presents a challenge for the Trans-Alaska Pipeline System
- Risk of stranded North Slope oil
- Oil and gas employs 1 in 3 Alaskan workers



As Global demand for Oil and Gas escalates, Arctic resources will likely be needed by Mid Century

20 years to bring fields to full production



Many Challenges

- Economic
 - Too expensive to produce in comparison to other areas



Environmental

- Spill risks
- Delicate and poorly understood ecological systems
- Pipeline construction
- Blowouts in cold and icy waters
- New DOI rules will help

 - Remoteness from markets
 - Lack of infrastructure
