

Community Resilience Disaster Zones (CDRZs)

- Community Disaster Resilience Zones Act channels federal, public, and private resources toward underserved communities that are most at-risk based on natural hazard risk and social vulnerability.
- FEMA designated first 483 census tracts as CDRZs.
- Include top 1% of tracts within the state with the highest individual risk rating.



Southeast Navigator Network

Pilot Program (10/2023 – 9/2024)

Establishes Navigators in 4 states to serve as partners to CDRZ communities and help them take advantage of funding, identify capacity-building opportunities, and secure the technical support necessary to create tangible resilience benefits.




















Climate Ready America

CDRZ in Florida


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32 CDRZs in 15 counties.

A CDRZ falls into the geographical boundaries of multiple local governments (county, municipal, and/or township governments).

Benefits:

- Access to Technical Assistance for resilience, hazard mitigation
- Eligibility in federal technical assistance programs (e.g., BRIC DTA, EPA Community Change grants)
- Increased federal cost share




CDRZ Maps for Southeast Florida


3 Counties 13 total census tracks

Technical Assistance Services

Existing services:

- Plan inventory and reviews
- Capacity augmentation
- Planning assistance / priority setting
 - "Inspiration Sessions" or in-depth project planning
- Connect to funding, resilience resources

Future expansion:

- Grant writing
- Financial and financing planning
- Engineering for implementation
- Experimentation with service delivery models

Impacts

39 Communities reached:

- Steps to Resilience, reviewed
- Over 60 different resources shared
- 5 FEMA, BRIC DTA secured
- Climate Central, Edge of America
 Tour
- Building relationships

In Progress / Planned:

- Notice of Interest (NOI) form for the FY 2024-25 Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA) and Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) programs
- Grant writing workshops
