



NOAA and partners race to rescue remaining Florida corals from historic ocean heat wave

OWXER (Climate gov would like to especially thank reviewers Jacqueline De La Cour and Jennifes Moore for their contributions to this article) In mid-July 2023, heat-stressed corals in the southern Florida Keys began bleachingexpelling their food-producing algal partners—amid the hottest water temperatures ever documented in the region during the satellite record (dating back to 1985). As weeks of heat stress have continued to accumulate, bleaching and death have become more widespread, raising fears of a mass mortality event on the region's already fracile reefs. 
Established a Reporting Method

- Added to website in mid-December for members to report unusual water issues or fish behavior
- Issued an advisory to members and started sharing the form with industry connections and local community
- FWC's Fish Kill Hotline was getting revamp in Dec/Jan and wasn't immediately available; it was also widely unknown









- Started compiling a collaborative of researchers interested in the situation
- Coordinated mass sampling and weekly phone calls with experts started in February
- Fishing guides were providing information (locations) & boat support for any organization wanting fish/water samples





Guides Were Playing an Integral Part





- Participating in the planning
- Managing reports from guides/public
- Contributing to messaging
- Utilizing our vessels and expertise

LKGA Guide Rapid Response Network (GRRN) was formed

- First-ever guide-led response network (entirety of the Keys)
- Acquire necessary equipment for night trips
- Procure sampling holding equipment & locations
- Compensate fishermen for equipment use, knowledge,
 & time


- Key West: Ocean's Edge Marina (inside the barn), 5950 Peninsular Ave, Key West, FL 33040

How LKGA GRRN Can Help You

Inclusion in Grants:

- Consider utilizing fishing guides with fieldwork
 - Flats Boats (1-2 researchers) = \$400 \$600/full day
 - Bay Boats (4-6 researchers) = \$1000 \$1200/full day
 - Light Tackle Boats (6-8 researchers) = \$1500+/full day
- Letters of Support Request on LKGA.org
