




Peer Review Statistics



- Opened for submissions in April 2021
- Opened for short course submissions in March 2023
- Since opening, 29 add-ons have been submitted for review
 - 23 have been accepted through the review process (79% accepted rate)

- New question and check box options for short courses
- Reviewer comments will appear with questions in review form(s)

Reviewers

- Short course time of review- 2 months
- New check box option on review form if reviewing a short course

- Scan the QR code to sign up as a Reviewer







Evaluation Updates

Quarterly Reports

- WRCEFS is compiling quarterly reports for each state
 - Includes basic statistics such as the number of trainings and average assessment scores
- Reports are emailed to individuals that submit data

Overall Pre-/Post- Data

From Sept. 2021 to Aug. 2022, more than 141 workshops and other educational opportunities were provided including:

- 71 PSA grower trainings
- 10 FSPCA PCHF trainings
- 6 FSPCA PCHF part 2 trainings
- 31 other food safety trainings














PSA Trainings



Data are from Sept. 1, 2021 through Feb. 28, 2023

- 88 PSA grower trainings held (in-person and remote)
- 6 states submitted pre-/posttraining data from 56 trainings
- 2 PSA Train-the-Trainer courses held in-person with 24 trained













PSA Follow-up Results


Top Actions taken since completing the PSA Training March 2022-April 2023

Implemented new food safety/hygiene protocols

Created or modified food safety record-keeping systems

Added new or modified existing on-farm infrastructure to improve food safety practices

Implemented new or different methods for cleaning or sanitizing food contact surfaces
















FSPCA Trainings
