Increasing Accessibility of Food Safety Education Through Remote Learning Opportunities

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Problem Statement / Issue Definition:

- Only 42% of farmers feel confident in the Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA) Produce Safety Rule after completing the Produce Safety Alliance Grower Training.
- 28% of growers have a worker training program in place to address FSMA produce safety requirements.
- Critical need for remote learning resources to provide ongoing food safety education for farmers.
- Developed accessible, remote learning resources specifically designed for small, beginning, and minority growers.


















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Approach / Methods:

- **1.** <u>**Recruit</u>** a Farmer Advisory Board representative of our target audience</u>
- 2. <u>Identify</u> topics our target audience struggle to grasp in traditional food safety workshops, some of those topics included:
 - Agricultural water
 - Sanitary design
 - Basic microbiology concepts
- **3.** <u>**Create</u>** a diversity of accessible resources alongside FAMU students and faculty for growers</u>

DIVERSE

Group of farmers from Tallahassee, FL that identify as Black, Hispanic, Asian and White.

RELEVANT

Majority of the board are beginner farmers interested in advancing their food safety skills.



Each farmer submits detailed feedback on how we should improve our food safety outreach program.







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Results / Outcomes:

The resources created include:

1. Produce Safety in Minutes*

5-minute videos on produce safety concepts

2. Instructor-led Webinars

Professors and Produce Safety experts teach farmers and students in a live zoom call about various produce safety

3. Case Presentations

Overviews of previous produce safety outbreaks are reviewed by experts in the field

4. Microbiology Basics*

Short video series on major pathogens involved in produce safety outbreaks
