NECAFS goal: Enhance produce safety and preventive controls training, education, and outreach among small and medium sized farms and small processors in the Northeast.

Approach: Increase fundamental shared PS & PC understanding of the region's educators and regulators through collaborative action. → They take this knowledge to their growers.





How do we increase fundamental understanding?

Build a regional **network** to **consolidate** food safety outreach and education efforts in a **collaborative** and consistent manner through strong network **facilitation**, resource **sharing**, **networking**, **consensus**-driven decision-making, and **interdisciplinary** action.



Employ the principles of collaboration, including:

- 1.) building trusting relationships
- 2.) provide voice for individual expert perspectives
- 3.) communication
- 4.) coordination







National Water Lab Map

Need: Help growers find a water testing lab that can conduct at least one method approved by the FDA.

Outcome: Interactive national map with 607 verified labs.









Produce Safety in Hydroponic and Aquaponic Operations

Need: Educators and regulators asked for introductory produce safety content specific to HP/AP operations.

Outcome: Creation of 5 topic-based factsheets to help educators and regulators get started.







Produce Safety Handbook for Buyers

Need: help buyers understand and navigate each state's produce safety audit and inspection information.

Outcome: Creation of interactive online tool that summarizes the Northeast produce food safety landscape, gives an overview of produce production, as well as each state's audit and inspection information.









Preventive Controls Workgroup

Need: Three areas of need identified: evaluation, resources, and awareness.

Outcome: Completion of:

- 1.) evaluation tool to be used by PC trainer across the region;
- 2.) interactive online resource collection to help processes get started with PCHF & GMPs; and,
- 3.) regional needs assessment to understand processor's awareness and subject matter needs → informs an outreach and awareness campaign.
