




RECOVER SYSTEM STATUS REPORTS

- **Sixth** in a series of reports beginning with the pilot report in 2006
- Analysis and reporting of **system-wide ecological indicators** of restoration progress
- 2019 Report includes monitoring data from **2012-2017** and a first ever **Report Card**
- Assist decision-makers with the timing of **planning and implementation of CERP projects**
- **Inform adaptive management** actions, and identify uncertainties that need further study to assure restoration success
- Evaluation of system-wide ecological indicators and uses **performance measures and their targets to measure restoration progress**
- Provides the **scientific foundation for the 2020 Report to Congress**, to inform the highest levels of the U.S. government on the progress made toward restoration
