Environmental Science & Research

Our team of renowned biologists support a variety of ongoing research projects specific to the native Southwest Florida environment. Key projects include sea turtle nesting and monitoring, mangrove restoration, water quality research and the impact of invasive species.

von Arx Wildlife Hospital

Located at the Conservancy Nature Center, the von Arx Wildlife Hospital admits more than 4,000 injured or orphaned patients each year. This emergency care facility specializes in the treatment and rehabilitation of native birds, small mammals and reptiles.
