# We are excited you will be presenting a poster at GGAA. Carefully review and follow these instructions.

#### **GGAA** will feature TWO MODES of poster presentations:

- 1) In-Person Posters: These will be presented live during a poster session at GGAA in Orlando, Florida.
- 2) Virtual Posters: GGAA registrants will view your poster PDF on a password protected virtual platform. There is no interactive component for this option. Include your email address in your poster so attendees can email you directly with questions.

NOTE: If your presentation preference has changed, email bmt@ufl.edu right away. Changes will be accommodated based on availability.

### **IMPORTANT ITEMS TO NOTE:**

- o Presentation preferences were indicated during abstract submission. Those who plan to attend in person and selected "no preference" but were <u>not</u> selected to give a talk, were scheduled to present a poster in person.
- The mode of presentation scheduled for your poster is indicated in the far right column of the GGAA Poster Directory.
- All poster PDF files (in person & virtual) will be visible on the password-protected virtual platform until the next GGAA.
- o All presenters must register and pay the fee by **March 4, 2022** to confirm participation.
- All poster PDF files (in person & virtual) must be submitted via this link by Friday, May 13, 2022. (No exceptions.)

# **Poster Design and Formatting Specifications:**

## All poster presenters are to create a <u>one-page poster</u> (16:9 aspect ratio - landscape format):

#### **Components of a Scientific Poster:**

- ✓ Presentation Title and Abstract
- ✓ Author and Co-author Names and Affiliations
- ✓ Primary Presenter Contact Info & Email Address
- ✓ Introduction: What are you investigating?

- ✓ Methodology: How did you conduct your research?
- ✓ Discussion of Data
- Results and Conclusions
- ✓ References and Acknowledgements

- o In-person posters will be presented during one of two poster sessions scheduled **June 6 & 7 from 5PM 8PM.**
- o In-person presenters will have 25 minutes to present a digital poster using a 55 inch touch screen monitor.
- o The in-person poster session is not being recorded or livestreamed.

# <u>Attention All Poster Presenters (In-Person and Virtual):</u>

### Submit Your Poster PDF via this link by Friday, May 13

- Name the PDF file <u>exactly</u> per the example: Abstract ID Number-Last Name-First Name. [EXAMPLE: 280-Jones-Edgar]
- o NOTE: Your abstract ID is indicated in the far left column of the GGAA Poster Directory.
- An extensive amount of time and effort is required to pre-load and link posters on the virtual platform. If we don't receive your
  poster PDF by the deadline, it may not be available for viewing during the conference.
