Poster Presenter Registration Deadline: March 4, 2022

We are excited you will be presenting a poster at GGAA. Carefully review and follow these instructions.

GGAA will feature TWO MODES of poster presentations:

- 1) **In-Person Posters:** These will be presented live during a poster session at GGAA in Orlando, Florida.
- 2) **Virtual Posters:** GGAA registrants will view your poster PDF on a password protected virtual platform. *There is no interactive component for this option. Include your email address in your poster so attendees can email you directly with questions.*

NOTE: If your presentation preference has changed, email bmt@ufl.edu right away. *Changes will be accommodated based on availability.*

IMPORTANT ITEMS TO NOTE:

- Presentation preferences were indicated during abstract submission. Those who plan to attend in person and selected “no preference” but were not selected to give a talk, were scheduled to present a poster in person.
- The mode of presentation scheduled for your poster is indicated in the far right column of the [GGAA Poster Directory](#).
- All poster PDF files (in person & virtual) will be visible on the password-protected virtual platform until the next GGAA.
- All presenters must register and pay the fee by **March 4, 2022** to confirm participation.
- All poster PDF files (in person & virtual) must be submitted [via this link](#) by **Friday, May 13, 2022**. (No exceptions.)

Poster Design and Formatting Specifications:

All poster presenters are to create a **one-page poster** (16:9 aspect ratio - landscape format):

- In-person posters will be presented during one of two poster sessions scheduled **June 6 & 7 from 5PM – 8PM**.
- In-person presenters will have 25 minutes to present a digital poster using a 55 inch touch screen monitor.
- The in-person poster session is not being recorded or livestreamed.

Attention All Poster Presenters (In-Person and Virtual):

Submit Your Poster PDF via this link by Friday, May 13

- Name the PDF file exactly per the example: *Abstract ID Number-Last Name-First Name*. **[EXAMPLE: 280-Jones-Edgar]**
- NOTE: Your abstract ID is indicated in the far left column of the [GGAA Poster Directory](#).
- An extensive amount of time and effort is required to pre-load and link posters on the virtual platform. **If we don't receive your poster PDF by the deadline, it may not be available for viewing during the conference.**
