GGAA 2022 In-person Digital (E-Poster) Information

Digital poster presentations (E-posters) are like traditional posters, <u>but they are not printed</u>. They are presented on a 55" LCD touchscreen TV in the landscape position (widescreen 16:9).

- You do NOT need to bring a printed poster with you.
- You must submit a PDF of your poster in advance by Friday, May 13. (See submission link below.)
- The organizers will PRE-LOAD all Poster PDFs for access during the assigned poster session.
- If you miss the deadline, your poster will <u>not</u> be available for viewing during the conference.
- Also save your poster file to a USB (thumb) drive and bring it with you the day of your presentation.
- A volunteer will be available to help call up your poster file at the time of your presentation.

Digital (E-Poster) Design and Formatting Specifications

- A well-constructed poster is self-explanatory, achieving both coverage and clarity.
- Your e-poster should consist of one slide.

Carefully review the Poster Design and Formatting Specifications section of this document.

How to Set Slide Size

In PowerPoint, open the "Design" tab on the ribbon menu and choose "Slide Size". **Select "Widescreen 16:9"** to configure the widescreen aspect ratio manually.

Here are two additional poster templates you may find helpful. You are not required to use them.

Additional tips you may find helpful

Use the tips below as quidelines for making the most of your poster presentation.

- Less is more. Be clear and concise with poster design and content. Overcrowding makes it difficult to read.
- Use fonts that are large enough to read at a distance.
- Include the title and name(s) of the presenter(s) in a larger, bolder font than the rest of the poster.
- Provide clear labels or headings for each section of your presentation.
- Remember contrast. Put light-colored fonts on dark backgrounds and dark-colored fonts on light backgrounds so viewers can see your text clearly.
- Imbed high-quality graphics and videos. (Don't use low resolution images or they will appear pixelated.)
- **Sound is not permitted** due to the open area in which posters are presented.
- To aid in networking, provide cards with your contact information that viewers can take away with them.

All FINAL poster PDFs (in person & virtual) must be submitted via this link by Friday, May 13.

If you miss the deadline, your poster will not be available for viewing during the conference. (No exceptions)
