






THE COLORADO DELTA REGION APPROXIMATE STATUS OF 1933 Scale 1:750 000



Colorado River: Challenges and Impacts

"The American Nile"

- One of the most heavily litigated rivers in the world.
- Arizona vs. California 1934.
- And 1936 and 1963 and 1964 and 1968.
- And 1979 and 1983 and 1984 and 2000.
- And the 320 Minutes to the 1944 US-Mexico water treaty.

Economic Impacts

- Irrigation of over 5 million acres, using approximately 80% of Colorado River water.
 - 15% of US agricultural production, plus Mexico
- Municipal water support for an estimated 40 million people.
- Hydropower: Up to 12 Billion kwatt hours per year.
- Annual economic impact of \$1.4 trillion.
- Reservoir use, fisheries, etc.



Restoration Milestones in the Riparian Corridor in Mexico *Restore*

2008: land concession to Pronatura Mexico and Sonoran Institute for restoration; formation of the Delta Water Trust

2012-2017: Minute 319 dedication of environmental flows and binational commitment to restoration

2014: pulse flow release and Minute 319 monitoring program

Sonoran Institute Restoration Overview/Objectives:

- Demonstrate that a relatively small amount of water can revive the Delta Ecosystem.
- Create a diversity of habitat types in restored areas to support wildlife and encourage community engagement.
- Develop an integrated restoration approach to consider ecologic, abiotic, and public interactions.
- Develop and implement a long-term ecological monitoring and adaptive management program to ensure long-term program success.



More than a decade of research and restoration served as foundation for the binational agreement: 2000 - Minute 306 ------ 2012 - Minute 319



Minute 319

- 5-year agreement signed in November 2012 by US and Mexico
- Establishes new guidelines for the management of Colorado River water during times of drought and promotes investments in water conservation projects
- Water dedicated for ecological flows to the Colorado River in Mexico for the 1st time in history
- 105,400 af provided by US and MX for experimental flood pulse flow
- Delta Water Trust to provide 52,700 af for river base flow
- At end of 5-year term, US and MX will determine if/how to expand commitments

Minute 319 Pulse Flow 130 million cubic meters, March 23-May 18, 2014








5-year restoration goal: 2300 acres

Total	840








Moving Forward

- Use Minute 319 science to to inform water needs and international negotiations.
- Science-based planning and adaptive management.
 - How much water is needed, where to maximize social and environmental returns.
- Capitalize on the momentum from Minute 319.
- Distribute restoration efforts from Morelos Dam to the estuary.
