## **The Big Picture**

2023 North Florida Regional Water Supply Plan

- Population projected to increase by 49% by 2045
- 32% increase in water demand 135 Million Gallons a Day (MGD)



Not meeting Minimum Flows and Levels (MFLs) with **CURRENT** pumping/permits!








Alachua County's grant-funded Irrigation Level Up Rebate Program encourages property owners to make improvements to their irrigation systems - increasing efficiency, reducing water use, and enhancing their existing landscapes. Many yards tend to waste water due to inefficient landscape and irrigation system design, poor installation, and a lack of regular maintenance.




Use Level Up funds to assist in addressing leaks and other system issues to conserve water and save money on your monthly utility bill.

#### **Alachua County Irrigation Design Code**

- 2016 First Adoption
- 2019 Added smart controllers
- 2023 Major overhaul
  - Limit permanent irrigation to 50% of lot/common area
  - Commercial systems maintenance documentation
  - Creative temporary irrigation solutions





## **Maintenance of Irrigation Systems**

<u>Commercial</u> systems must <u>register</u> with the County and provide <u>annual</u> documentation of irrigation system inspections detailing water conservation activities, such as:

- Repairing leaks
- Adjusting irrigation schedules
- Adjusting and repositioning bubblers




















#### **Temporary Irrigation Solutions**

### **Irrigation Restrictions**

Your system was noted in violation of local irrigation restrictions on: /

Your irrigation system was:

Operating on the wrong day
Operating at the wrong time
Operating in or after the raine

Ensure your rainfall shutoff device is set to active or replace if needed.

In need of <u>maintenance</u> (Check for overspray, broken heads, pipes, etc.)

\*Irrigation systems must be inspected annually for leaks and adjustments

Roughly 60% of residential water use in Alachua County occurs outside. By following restrictions, you help conserve water in the aquifer that feeds local springs and rivers. Thank you for doing your part to protect local water!

#### Once a week year-round irrigation restrictions could reduce water use by 40%

## Homeowner Association Florida-Friendly Landscaping<sup>TM</sup> Code

- HOAs cannot prohibit implementation of FFL and cannot require permanent irrigation
- Maturing landscapes and shade
